1. Go to <http://www.oria.cornell.edu/training/citi/login/index.cfm>. Use your Cornell NetID and password to log in. You will be directed to a training website called CITI. **If you need help accessing this site, email rcr@cornell.edu.**


3. Click on "Cornell University Courses." Then click on "Add a Course or Update Learner Groups."

8. You can now begin the first training module. After reading each module you will take a quiz to test your knowledge. You must pass each quiz. If you fail a quiz, you will be shown correct answers to the questions. Then you can return to the module and re-take the quiz. You can repeat a module and quiz as many times as you need to pass.
